

Announcing 2024 Mini-Conference

Expanded Anthology Word Count

We're expanding our submission word-count limit to 6,500! Now you can submit longer pieces or multiple short pieces that add up to 6,500 words max. If submitted separately, each piece will require a \$10 fee for members.

You also have the opportunity to include a professional headshot with your bio! Headshots and bios deadline to be set for after the September mini-conference. Remember, the manuscript submission deadline is July 31, so scroll down for a reminder of this year's anthology theme. And get to writing!




In November, I signed a contract with WordWise Media out of California and am now represented by Steven Hutson, literary agent.


Current members pay just \$10 per submission! Non-members who pay \$50 for the first submission and \$10 for additional pieces receive membership for the rest of the year.
