



I encourage you to take the next step in your membership and become part of the board of directors. Your help is needed and appreciated. Don't miss this opportunity.



Date of your most recent renewal of your Texas High Plains Writers membership (details for verification).

Kindly refrain from including your Discord account password, as we do not require it for the invitation process.

Once we receive your request, we will promptly send you an invite within the Discord app, granting you access to our vibrant community of writers and critique partners.
